inhabitants of such city or village shall exceed one thousand, and the person so appointed shall be a resident of the village or city in which he is appointed, and shall hold office during the pleasure of such sheriff, and as soon as a vacancy shall occur in the office of such deputy, or he become incapable of executing the same, another shall in like manner be appointed in his place, for whose official acts, said sheriff shall be responsible as in case of other deputies or under sheriffs.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 51.

AN ACT to repeal chapter one hundred and eighty of the general laws of 1867, entitled "an act to prohibit the picking and sale of unripe cranberries."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Repealed.

SECTION 1. Chapter one hundred and eighty of general laws of 1867, entitled "an act to prohibit the picking and sale of unripe cranberries," is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.
