AN ACT relating to the University of Wisconsin, and amendatory of section nine, chapter one hundred and fourteen of general laws of 1866, entitled "an act to re-organize and enlarge the University of Wisconsin, and to authorize the county of Dane to issue bonds in aid thereof."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended.

Who entitled to free tuition.

SECTION 1. Section nine (9) of chapter one hundred and fourteen (114) of the general laws of 1866, entitled "an act to re-organize and enlarge the University of Wisconsin, and to authorize the county of Dane to issue bonds in aid thereof," is hereby amended so as to read as follows: One suitably qualified pupil from each assembly district whenever a vacancy shall occur, to be nominated by the representative of such district in the legislature of the state, who, other things being equal, shall prefer an orphan of a soldier who has died in defense of his country, and all graduates of any graded school of the state who shall have passed an examination at such graded school satisfactory to the faculty of the University for admission into the subfreshman class and the college classes of the University, shall be at once and at all times entitled to free tuition in all the colleges of the University.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
