

CHAPTER 254.

[Published March 23, 1874.]

AN ACT to authorize the judge of the 8th judicial circuit to change the time of holding court.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Judge may alter time for holding court.

To publish his order.

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for the circuit judge in the eighth judicial circuit of this state, to alter the time for holding terms of the court in the county of St. Croix, in said circuit, by order to be made by him and published in one or more newspapers of general circulation in such circuit, sixty days before such order shall take effect: *provided*, that this act shall not authorize the diminution of the number of terms of court as now prescribed by law to be held annually in each of the counties in said circuit.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 255.

[Published March 17, 1874.]

AN ACT in relation to building town halls.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The qualified electors in the several townships in this state are hereby authorized to determine by vote at any legal town meeting or election hereafter to be held, whether they are in favor or not of uniting the moneys of said town (raised or to be raised) with the moneys of any other legal corporation doing business in said town, for the purpose of purchasing or building a hall or other buildings for the use of said town and said corporation: *provided*, that previous notice of submitting this question to a vote of the electors has been given as hereinafter provided.
