CHAPTER 224.

[Published March 13, 1875.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of Charles J. Pardee, a justice of the peace in the county of Columbia.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Acts localized. Section 1. All the acts of Charles J. Pardee, a justice of the peace in the town of Wyocena, Columbia county, are hereby legalized, and declared to be as valid and binding, in all respects, as if the said Pardee had filed his official bond in the office of the clerk

of the circuit court of said county, within the time limited therefor by law.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 225.

[Published March 10, 1875.]

AN ACT to repeal chapter sixty-one, of the private and local laws of 1853, entitled an act to declare the Baraboo river a navigable stream.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Repealed. Section 1. Chapter sixty-one, of the private and local laws of 1853, is hereby repealed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
