

CHAPTER 75.

[Published March 3, 1875.]

AN ACT to relieve the county of Clark from the payment of state tax illegally assessed upon lands not liable to taxation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

State treasurer to settle certain claims.

SECTION 1. That the state treasurer is hereby authorized to adjust and settle with the county treasurer of the county of Clark, any and all claims which the said county of Clark has against the state for state taxes, (so called), illegally assessed in the years of 1864 and 1865, upon any and all lands in said county not then liable to taxation, belonging to the "Fox and Wisconsin River Improvement Company;" *provided*, that said treasurer shall not make any such settlement until the attorney general shall have certified to the state treasurer that in his opinion the lands aforesaid were not legally taxable for said years.

Clark county to be credited with amount found due.

SECTION 2. That in case any sum is found due to said county of Clark upon such settlement, the state treasurer is hereby authorized to credit the said county of Clark, in the account with said county, with such sum, and the said county is hereby relieved from the payment of the same.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 76.

AN ACT to amend section one (1), of chapter one hundred and forty-four (144), general laws of 1873, entitled, "An act fixing the time when brook-trout may be caught from any of the waters in Ashland, Bayfield and Douglas counties."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows;

Amended.

SECTION 1. Section one (1), of chapter one hundred and forty-four (144), is hereby amended by striking

out the word "March" in the fourth line of said section, and inserting the word "February," so that the section as amended will read as follows: "Section 1. Brook-trout may be caught, as now provided by law, in any of the waters in Ashland, Bayfield and Douglas counties between the first day of February and the fifteenth day of September, following, in each year." All acts and parts of acts, so far as they conflict with this law, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 77.

[Published March 3, 1875.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 96 of the revised statutes, entitled "Of the powers of the circuit court over the estate of infants, insane persons and habitual drunkards."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Proceedings for the conveyance of any real estate by an infant, or for the sale of the real estate of any infant in any of the cases provided in chapter ninety-six (96) of the revised statutes, may be commenced in vacation or during a term of the circuit court, and the circuit judge may make any order in such proceedings at chambers or in vacation, which the court would be authorized to make. And any order so made by the circuit judge in any such proceeding which shall hereafter be commenced in any circuit court, shall have the same force and effect as if the same had been made by the court.
