

CHAPTER 78.

[Published March 3, 1875.]

AN ACT to amend chapter five hundred (500), local laws of 1868, entitled, "An act to consolidate and amend an act to incorporate the city of Madison, and the several acts amendatory thereof."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended. SECTION 1. Section six (6), of chapter three (3), of said act is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 6. The chief of police shall perform such duties as shall be prescribed, by ordinance for the preservation of the public peace and the collection of fines and license moneys. He shall possess all the powers of a constable at common law or by the laws of this state, and receive like fees; but shall not receive any fees for serving any process, making any arrest or performing any duties from the city of Madison, except his per diem hereinbefore provided. Chief of police. The said policemen of each ward shall be under the control and direction of the mayor and chief of police, and shall have all the powers and perform all the duties of constable under the laws of the state of Wisconsin. Policemen to be under control of mayor.

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 79.

[Published March 3, 1875.]

AN ACT relating to statistics for use of state and county boards of assessments.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Whenever any town, village or city clerk shall fail in any year to return to the county clerk, within the time fixed by law, the statement required by section two of chapter one hundred and County clerk to send messenger for returns overdue.
