d. SECTION 1. The acts of the town board of supervisors, of the town of Stanfold, in Barron county, so far as they relate to the establishment of the width of highways, within the limits of said town, at three rods, are hereby legalized and declared valid, and in full force and effect.

AN ACT to extend the time for settlers upon certain railroad landgrant lands to acquire title thereto.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Time for proving settlement extended.

SECTION 1. The time mentioned in section 14, chapter 126, of general laws of 1874, entitled, "An act to confer certain lands upon the North Wisconsin Railway Company, and the Chicago and Northern Pacific Air-Line Railway Company, and to execute the trusts assumed by the State of Wisconsin by its acceptance of the grants of land made by congress, by acts approved June 3, 1856, and May 5, 1864," for proving settlement and cultivation upon the lands in said section referred to, is hereby extended one year from the passage of this act.
