obstructing of this great natural channel-way at a point where there is an average transit of our craft every six minutes, demanding a safe passage.

Resolved, That our Senators be instructed and our Representatives in Congress be requested to oppose any bill authorizing the bridging of said river.

Resolved, That the Governor be authorized and instructed to forward a copy of these resolutions to each of our Senators and Members of Congress.
