the company executing such mortgage or trust deed might or could have done if such foreclosure or sale had not taken place.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after the passage and publication.

CHAPTER 145.

AN ACT to amend chapter 82 of the general laws of 1859, entitled "An act to provide for the more efficient punishment of certain offenses."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended.

Persons committed for vagrancy and criminal offenses may be sentenced to hard labor. SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 82 of the general laws of 1859, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: "Whenever a y person shall hereafter be convicted in any court of this state, of vagrancy, drunkenness, or of any criminal offense, and sentenced to imprisonment in the county jail, the court may also sentence such person to be kept at hard labor during the term of his or her imprisonment, either within or without the jail, as hereinafter provided; and all persons who shall hereafter be convicted of any offense, in any court of this state, and sentenced to pay a fine, and shall, in default of payment of such fine, be committed to jail, may, during the term of such jimprisonment for default of payment of such fine, be sentenced to be kept at hard labor."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage and publication.
