

account with the state with the sum of nine thousand six hundred and thirty-one dollars and seven cents, being the amount on deposit to the credit of said warden in the Corn Exchange Bank at Waupun, at the time of the failure of said bank. And the directors of the state prison are hereby directed to allow and credit said amount to the account of said warden, and thereupon he shall be released from all liability on account of said sum of money.

SECTION 2. Any dividend or payment the said warden or his successor in office may receive from the assignee of the estate of said Corn Exchange Bank, now in bankruptcy, or from any person on account or in consequence of said deposits, shall be accounted for by him in the same manner as other moneys received by him for said prison. Dividends to be accounted for.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

### CHAPTER 187.

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter two hundred and eighty-nine of the general laws of 1877, relative to the employment of children in factories or other workshops in this state.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and eighty-nine of the laws of 1877, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 1. It shall hereafter be unlawful to employ any child or children under twelve years of age at any manual labor in any factory or other workshops, where more than three persons are employed in this state, and no child or children of twelve and under fourteen years of age shall be so employed in any such factory or workshops for more than seven months in any one year. Amended.  
Unlawful to employ children in certain cases.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
