That section one of chapter two hun- Amended. dred and ten of the laws of Wisconsin for 1875 be amended so as to read as follows: It shall be unlaw- Unlawful to ful for any person or persons to pursue, trap, ensnare trap furred or kill any otter, beaver, mink, muskrat or other fur bearing animals upon any lands, or to the middle of any stream of water adjoining the lands owned by any person or persons engaged in the business of breeding and rearing such animals.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 193.

AN ACT relating to the preservation of game, and amendatory of section one of chapter three hundred and twenty-nine, of the laws of Wisconsin for 1874, and to repeal chapter one hundred and twenty-one, of the laws of Wisconsin for 1874, entitled "An act for the preservation of game in the counties of Eau Claire, Chippewa, Dunn, Trempealeau, Buffalo and Pepin," and to repeal chapter two hundred of the laws of Wisconsin for 1877, entitled "An act for the preservation of game, and amendatory of section one of chapter one hundred and twenty-one of the laws of Wisconsin for 1874."
