## CHAPTER 59.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and fifty-one of the laws of 1873, entitled an act to incorporate the city of Neenah, and the several acts amendatory thereof.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The laws of the state of Wisconsin, for the relief and support of the poor in towns, shall apply to the said city of Neenah; and the common council shall annually levy a tax, not exceeding one mill, upon the dollar of the assessed valuation of the real and personal property of the said city, for the purpose of the support of the poor of such city lawfully entitled thereto, such tax to be levied and collected in the same manner as other city taxes.

State laws for relief and support of poor to apply.

SECTION 2. The common council shall appoint a suitable and proper person to act as overseer of the poor of said city, whose salary shall not exceed the sum of one hundred dollars per annum; such overseer shall have the same power, and shall perform the same duties as overseers of the several towns: *provided, however,* that he shall keep such accounts, and shall at all times be subject to and obey all orders and resolutions of the common council, lawfully made in the premises, and concerning his duties; and shall report from time to time as the common council shall direct.

Council to appoint overseer of poor.

SECTION 3. Immediately after the passage of this act, the common council shall elect an overseer of the poor, who shall hold his office until the next annual election of city officers; and thereafter, and at each annual election of city officers, the common council shall elect, with other officers, an overseer of the poor, who shall hold his office for one year, subject to removal by the common council.

Appointment to be made annually.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.
