CHAPTER 8.

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of David Jenkins, a justice of the peace in Fond du Lac county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All the official acts of David Jenkins, Legalized. as a justice of the peace of the county of Fond du Lac, are hereby legalized and declared in all respects legal and binding, the same as if his official bond and oath had been on file as required by law.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 9.

AN ACT to provide for special terms of the circuit court in the seventh judicial circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Each and every general term of the Special terms. circuit court held in the counties of Marathon, Portage, Waupaca, and Wood, shall be special terms for the whole seventh judicial circuit.

SECTION 2. At any special term of said court here- Business not restricted at special term. in provided for, any and all business may be done arising or pending in said circuit, or any of the counties therein, which might be done at any general term, except the trial of issues of fact.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
