CHAPTER 90.

AN ACT to authorize the city of Waupaca to enter into a contract with the county of Waupaca in relation to the purchase of a court house for purposes of a city hall.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Contingency tpon which city sha!! purchase court house. SECTION 1. The city of Waupaca by its common council is hereby authorized and empowered to enter into a contract with the board of building commissioners, appointed for and on behalf of Waupaca county, to superintend the building of a new court house in said county, pursuant to the provisions of an ordinance passed by the board of supervisors of Waupaca county at its annual meeting in November, in 1880, to the effect that said city shall bind itself to purchase said court house of said county upon the happening of a certain contingency, and upon the terms and conditions mentioned in section five of said ordinance.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 91.

AN ACT to facilitate the sale of a certain tract of school land in Columbia county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Lands authorized to be sold. SECTION 1. The commissioners of the public lands are hereby authorized and empowered to sell for a sum not less than one hundred dollars, on such terms as other school lands are sold, the tract described as lot number twenty-four (24), section sixteen (16), township thirteen (13) north, of range twelve (12) east, in Columbia county, containing four and ainety nine one-hundredths acres, according to the state survey of said section sixteen.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication.
