## CHAPTER 8.

AN ACT fixing the terms of court in the Tenth Judicial Circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The general terms of the circuit court Times and for the tenth judicial circuit, shall be held as follows: piaces for hold-ing courts In the county of Shawano, on Tuesday after the second axed. Monday in January, and Tuesday after the first Monday in July. In the county of Door, on Tuesday after the third Monday in February, and Tuesday after the third Monday in July. In the county of Marinette, on the second Monday in March, and the second Monday in November. In the county of Langlade, on the last Monday in March, and Tuesday after the first Monday in September. In the county of Brown, on the first Monday in April, and the first Monday in October. In the county of Oconto, on the third Monday in May, and the third Monday in September. In the county of Outagamie, on the first Monday in June, and the first Monday in December.

SECTION 2. Every general term in the counties of General term Marinette, Oconto, Brown and Outagamie, shall be a shall be special term for the whole individual term for whole special term for the whole judicial circuit, at which any district. and all business may be done arising or pending in any county of said circuit, which might be done at a general term for the county in which such business arises, or is pending, except the trial of issues of fact by a

All acts or parts of acts inconsistent Section 4.

with this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
