CHAPTER 64.

AN ACT to authorize A. W. Lawrence and others to build and maintain a dock in the waters of Sturgeon bay.

Build a dock.

SECTION 1. A. W. Lawrence, L. M. Washburn, C. M. Charnley and Lester Bradner, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized to build and maintain a dock in the waters of Sturgeon bay, in the county of Door, from undivided block two (2) in Rodger's plat of lots in Sturgeon Bay, now included in the village of Sturgeon Bay, and to extend the same into the waters of said bay the distance of one hundred feet.

CHAPTER 65.

AN ACT to authorize A. W. Lawrence, L. M. Washburn, C. M. Charnley and Lester Bradner to build and maintain a pier in the waters of Sturgeon bay.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Build a pier.

SECTION 1. A. W. Lawrence, L. M. Washburn, C. M. Charnley and Lester Bradner, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized to build, extend and maintain a pier in the waters of Sturgeon bay, in Door county, from lot three (3), in section seven (7), in town twenty-seven (27) north of range twenty-six (26) east, on or near the site of the present pier known as Schjoth's pier, and extending into the waters of said bay the distance of three hundred (300) feet.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
