CHAPTER 124.

AN ACT to legalize the acts of James E. Newell, a justice of the peace of Vernon county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Legalized.

SECTION 1. The official acts of James E. Newell, who was elected a justice of the peace, within and for the county of Vernon, on the first Tuesday of April, 1881, are hereby declared to be as legal to all intents and purposes, as though the said James E. Newell had been a qualified elector of the town of Viroqua, in said county at the time of his election.

Section 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication. Approved March 21, 1883.

CHAPTER 125.

AN ACT to legalize the acts of Charles A. Roberts, a justice of the peace of Vernon county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Legalized.

Section 1. The official acts of Charles A. Roberts, who was elected a justice of the peace within and for the county of Vernon, on the first Tuesday of April in the years 1878, 1880 and 1882, are hereby declared to be as legal to all intents and purposes as though the said Charles A. Roberts had been a qualified elector of the town of Viroqua, in said county, at the time of his election.

Section 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication.
