CHAPTER 27.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to the persons therein named for expenses incurred as legislative visiting committee to state institutions.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, for expenses incurred as visiting committee of the legislature for 1883 to state institutions, the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300)—to James Hill, James J. Rasmussen and George A. Abert, one hundred dollars (\$100) each.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 28.

AN ACT to provide for the publication of the report of the professor of agriculture, W. H. Henry, for the year 1882, and for the distribution of the same.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation
for printing
report.

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby directed to have printed, by the state printer, in pamphlet form not to exceed one hundred pages each, six thousand copies of the report of Prof. W. H. Henry, made to the governor on the experiments in amber cane and the ensilage of fodder for the year 1882. Two thousand copies to be delivered to Professor Henry for distribution, and four thousand copies for the use of the legislature; and there is hereby appropriated out of the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, a sufficient sum to carry out the provisions of this act.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
