CHAPTER 112.

AN ACT to create inspection district number fifteen and appoint inspectors therefor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Inspection district number fifteen.

SECTION 1. All territory, within which logs or lumber are cut, to be banked on the Namakagon River and its tributaries above the west line of Sawyer county, shall be known as inspection district number fifteen.

Inspector to be appointed by governor.

SECTION 2. The governor of the state of Wisconsin, shall appoint an inspector of lumber district number fifteen, who shall keep his office at the village of Hayward, in Sawyer county, Wisconsin, and who shall be responsible for his acts and the acts of his deputies, the same as now provided by law. All acts and parts of acts, as far as they conflict with this act are hereby repealed.

Repealing clause.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication. Approved March 19, 1885.

CHAPTER 113.

AN ACT to provide for the purchase of an additional number of Blue Books for 1885.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Additional number of blue books to be ordered.

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby instructed to contract for the publication of eight thousand copies of the blue book for the year 1885, at a cost not to exceed ninety cents per copy, the book to be in every respect as good as those now published, or to be published for the present year. Said books are to be published and delivered into the hands of the secretary of state on, or before the first day of April, 1885.

SECTION 2. The secretary of state shall distribute said blue books as follows: Fifty copies each to the governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state treasurer, attorney general, state superintendent, railroad commissioner, insurance commissioner, superintendent of public property, members of the senate and assembly, and the chief clerks and sergeants-at-arms thereof; one copy to each member of the supreme court, and a sufficient number to the state library for exchange, one copy to the chairman of each county board of supervisors, three copies to each of the post-masters, assistant clerks and book-keepers, and one copy to each of the clerks and employes, including the extra employes in the senate and assembly, except messenger boys; one copy to each of the reporters who have been regularly employed for the session in reporting legislative proceedings for daily-papers; one copy to each member of the state boards appointed by the governor.

Distribution same.

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated out of the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum of money sufficient to carry out the provisions of this act.

Appropriation.

SECTION 4. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 114.

AN ACT to provide apartments for the Wisconsin Academy of Sciences, Arts and Letters, in the Capitol.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The governor is authorized to assign to the Wisconsin Academy of Sciences, Arts and Letters, suitable rooms in the capitol for the meetings of the Academy, the preservation of its library, and the proper exhibition of its collec-
