CHAPTER 13.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money therein named for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Wisconsin State Commission in making the state exhibit at the New Orleans World's Exposition, and to reimburse parties in the several parts of the state who have made advancements to the said state exhibit fund.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Appropriated
\$12,000 to defray
expenses of
Commission.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twelve thousand dollars, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the commission for the state of Wisconsin in making the state exhibit at the New Orleans World's Exposition.

Auditory
board.

SECTION 2. The governor, the secretary of state and the state treasurer, shall constitute a board of auditors, before whom all bills for services, transportation or other expenses shall be presented and allowed before any of the fund hereby appropriated shall be paid out of the state treasury.

Duties of audi-
tors.

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of the board of auditors named in section 2, of this act, to first audit and allow all advancements made by parties for the said purpose of making the state exhibit with interest from date of advancement.

Appropriations
how paid.

SECTION 4. The appropriation made by this act shall be paid out of the treasury from time to time as may be necessary, upon the warrants of the secretary of state, made in accordance with the requisitions in writing of the board of auditors herein constituted.

Excess of
appropriation.

SECTION 5. Whatever of the fund hereby appropriated, shall remain after defraying the expenses hereinfore named, and reimbursing the parties who have made advancements shall remain in and be a part of the general fund.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
