CHAPTER 137.

AN ACT to change the boundary line of Langlade county, and to attach certain territory herein-after described thereto, and to organize the same.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All that portion of the county of Shawano, to wit: Townships thirty-one, thirty-two and thirty-three north, of ranges thirteen and fourteen, together with sections five, six, seven, eight, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen, twenty, twenty-nine, thirty, thirty-one and thirty-two, of township thirty-one north, of range fifteen east, are hereby detached from Shawano county and attached to and the same shall hereafter constitute a part of Langlade county. Boundary lines changed.

SECTION 2. Said territory is hereby attached to and made a part of the town of Polar in said Langlade county. A part of town of Polar.

SECTION 3. The county of Langlade as hereby constituted shall be and remain a part of the assembly district and senatorial district of which the said county of Langlade now forms a part. Assembly district.

SECTION 4. The electors residing within the territory hereby attached to Langlade county and to the town of Polar in said county, may organize as a town, to be known as the town of Langlade, by holding a town meeting on the first Tuesday of April, 1885, and the election and qualification of town officers for said town for said year 1885. New town may be organized.

Said election shall be held at the school house in New, on section twenty-seven, town thirty-three, range thirteen east. If said town meeting is held and the organization of said town of Langlade completed by the election and qualification of officers for said town for the year 1885, then said territory shall constitute a town under the laws of this state and the same shall be known as the town of Langlade, otherwise said territory shall remain a part of the said town of Polar.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 138.

AN ACT to amend section 1365, chapter 54, of the revised statutes of 1878, as amended by chapter 205, of the laws of 1881, relating to drains.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Relating to
drain law

SECTION 1. Section 1365, chapter 54, of the revised statutes of 1878, as amended by chapter 205, of the laws of 1881, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 1365. Whenever six or more freeholders residing in each of two adjoining towns, shall wish to have any swamp, marsh or overflowed lands, lying in said adjoining towns, or in either of them, drained by a ditch or drain laid out or constructed partly in each of said towns, or wholly in either, to drain the same, or for such purpose, to straighten or enlarge any water-course lying partly in each of said towns or wholly in either, they may join in making an application, in writing, in duplicate, to the supervisors of both of said towns, in the same manner as provided in section 1359, and such supervisors shall act together and proceed in the same manner in giving notice, deciding upon the application and making the orders, determinations, maps, plans, estimates, awards and assessments, and in all other proceedings as hereinbefore provided for
