CHAPTER 401.

AN ACT relating to justices of the peace, elected in the second and fourth wards of the city of Manitowoc.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authorized to hold office in either of said wards. SECTION 1. Each of the justices of the peace elected in the second and fourth wards of the city of Manitowoc, is hereby authorized to hold and keep his office and place of business in either of said wards.

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 402.

AN ACT to authorize Canute Anderson, his heirs and assigns to construct and maintain a dam in and across Wood river, in Burnett county, Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authorized to maintain a dam.

Section 1. Canute Anderson, his heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to erect, keep up and maintain a dam across Wood river, in Burnett county, on the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of section twenty-eight, in township thirty-eight, north of range eighteen west, for hydraulic and flooding purposes; said dam shall not raise the water to exceed six feet, and shall be provided with a suitable slide or chute for the passage of logs and timber over the same. Said Canute Anderson, his heirs and assigns, shall keep said dam and slide or chute in repair, and shall keep
