CHAPTER 132.

AN ACT to authorize a final settlement with the employes of the bureau of labor statistics, prior to April 4th, 1885.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authorizing secretary of state to audit accounts of Edward F. Appleby, et al.

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby authorized and directed to audit the accounts of Edward F. Appleby, E. W. Keyes, Jr., and Matt. J. Simpelaar, and draw his warrants on the state treasurer in their favor, at the rate of one hundred dollars per month for the time they were employed in the bureau of labor statistics, prior to April 4, 1885; except that said Matt. J. Simpelaar shall receive but three hundred twenty-five dollars, which sum is hereby appropriated to him.

Accounts to be verified, etc.

SECTION 2. The time for which they are entitled to compensation under this act shall be stated by the said Edward F. Appleby and E. W. Keyes, Jr., under oath, and be attested by the commissioner of the bureau so employing them; and they each and all named herein shall, before receiving the compensation provided herein, sign receipts in full of all claims against the state or its officers by reason of the service mentioned in this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.
