which such unpaid tax is due. Such receipt shall be signed by the treasurer, and a duplicate thereof made upon the stub thereof to be left in the book, and after noting the payment of such taxes upon the tax roll, he shall deliver said receipt to the person entitled thereto.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 141.

AN ACT to provide payment for the officiating chaplains of the senate and assembly.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The sum of fifteen dollars is hereby Appropriation authorized to be paid to each and every clergy tive chaplains man who has officiated as chaplain of the senate or assembly for one week or more during the session of the legislature for the year 1887; said amount to be paid upon the certificates of the chief clerks of the senate and assembly.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of the state treasury a sum sufficient to carry out the provisions of this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication. Approved March 25, 1887.
