## CHAPTER 445.

AN ACT to authorize counties to aid towns in building and repairing highways.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Whenever the town board of supervisors of any town, shall file its petition with the county board of supervisors of the county in which said town is situated, setting forth the fact that such town, in addition to the usual highway tax levied according to law, has voted to make or repair any road or roads wholly or partly within such town, designating as near as may be the location of such road or roads, and further stating that such town has provided for the payment of one-half of the cost of the construction or repairs, the said county board may appropriate the other half of such cost, and cause such sum to be levied upon the taxable property of the county as will, with the amount provided by said town, be sufficient to defray the expense of making or repairing such road or roads so petitioned for; and such money, when collected, shall be paid out on the order of the chairman of the county board and county clerk, whenever the said town shall notify them that the work has been completed and accepted.

Authorizing counties to aid towns in building highways.

SECTION 2. The county board may, at the time of acting upon such petition, designate two of its members, who shall act as its commissioners, and who shall co-operate with the supervisors of such town, and such commissioners from the county board shall have full charge and authority in the

County board to designate commissioners to take charge of work.

letting, inspecting and accepting of the work; provided, that nothing in this act contained shall be construed to prohibit any county from making or repairing any roads in such county if it shall so desire, and in case of whole of the cost of construction of any road or roads is to be borne by any county, or in case any county shall arrange with such town so as to assume and have exclusive charge of such work, then the county board may direct the letting, inspecting and accepting of such work in such manner as it may deem proper.

SECTION 3. This act shall be in effect on and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 446.

AN ACT to amend chapter 306, of the laws of 1885, relating to notice of expiration of time to redeem from tax sales.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Amending section 1170, R. S.—notice of expiration of time to redeem from tax sales—how given.

SECTION 1. Section 1170, of chapter 50, of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 306, of the laws of 1885, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 1170. Each county clerk shall, at least six and not more than ten months before the expiration of the time limited for redeeming lands sold as aforesaid, cause to be published in a newspaper printed in the county in which said lands are located, if there be such a newspaper, and if there is none, then in a newspaper printed in an adjoining county, if there be one; but if there be no newspaper printed in the same or an adjoining county, then in the official state paper, once a week for twelve successive weeks, a list of all unredeemed lands, specifying each tract or lot, the name of the person to whom assessed, if to any, and the amount of taxes
