## CHAPTER 78.

AN ACT to amend chapter 265, of the general laws of 1885, entitled, "an act to provide for the collection of highway and sidewalk taxes in villages embracing parts of two or more towns."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Chapter 265, laws 1885, not to pply to certur vidages.

SECTION 1. Chapter 265, of the laws of 1885, entitled, "an act to provide for the collection of highway and sidewalk taxes in villages embracing parts of two or more towns," shall not apply to villages having less than three thousand population by the state census of the year, 1885.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.—The foregoing act having been presented to the governor for his approval, and not having been returned by him to the house of the legislature in which it originated, within the time prescribed by the constitution of the state, has become a law without his approval.
