

duties as such judge in addition to the salary now provided for by law, and this act shall apply to the several judges now in office; such expenses to be computed from and after the first day of July, A. D. 1889, and paid quarterly at the time and in the manner that the salaries of such judges are paid.

Appropriation. SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated annually out of the general fund a sum sufficient to carry out the provisions of this act.

Repeal. SECTION 3. All acts and parts of acts conflicting with the provisions of this act, so far as they conflict herewith, are hereby (repealed).

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 264.

AN ACT to appropriate to the Veteran's Home at Waupaca, the sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

**Appropriation
to Veterans'
Home,
Waupaca.**

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Wisconsin Veteran's Home at Waupaca, out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and for the uses and purposes herein mentioned, as follows: To pay indebtedness of said home already incurred, nine thousand dollars; for water supply and heating purposes, ten thousand dollars; for the erection and construction of cottages, six thousand dollars; for other permanent improvements, including dining room and kitchen and furnishing the same, woman's hall, widow's living room, directors and superintendent's room and office, store room, furnishing and heating hospital, cemetery grounds and improvements thereon, laying out, fencing and improving the grounds of the home, sewerage, clothing for inmates, furni-

ture, bedding, ice house, barn, farming utensils, teams, harness, wagons, hay and platform scales, fuel, cows, and such other improvements and articles as shall be certified by the president and secretary of the board of trustees of said home to be necessary, a sum not to exceed in the aggregate, twenty-five thousand dollars.

SECTION 2. Before any money appropriated by this act shall be drawn from the state treasury, for the use of said home as herein provided, the treasurer of the board of trustees of said home shall make and execute to the state of Wisconsin, a bond in the penal sum of fifty thousand dollars with two or more good and sufficient sureties, who shall severally justify their liability on oath; such sureties and bond to be approved by the governor and such bond shall be conditioned upon the faithful and honest application of all moneys appropriated by this act and received by such treasurer, for the uses and purposes in this act specified, and a correct and faithful accounting thereof, as in this act provided; and such bond when so made, executed and approved, shall be placed on file in the office of the secretary of state.

Treasurer of trustees to execute bond to state.

SECTION 3. The several sums appropriated by this act, may from time to time as required, after the executing and filing the bond provided for in the preceding section be drawn in whole or in part, upon certificate of the president and secretary of the board of trustees of said home which certificate shall set forth the amount of money required and for what specific purpose. Such certificate shall be officially endorsed by the secretary of state and when approved by the governor, shall upon presentation, be paid by the state treasurer; provided, however, that the acceptance by said Wisconsin Veteran's Home of the amount hereby appropriated shall vest the title to the real estate of said home in the state of Wisconsin subject to the right of said home to have the use, enjoyment and possession of said real estate for a home for soldiers, sailors and marines and their wives and widows as long as said home shall use said real estate for such purposes, and said Wisconsin Veterans' Home shall convey said real estate to the state of Wisconsin by a good and sufficient warranty deed in accordance with the spirit and intent of this act within

one year after the passage and publication of this act.

SECTION 4. The treasurer of the board of trustees of the Wisconsin Veteran's Home, at the close of the fiscal year next preceding the biennial session of the legislature of this state in 1891, shall make a report to such legislature, which report shall contain, in addition to a true statement respecting the general condition of the home and its inmates, an itemized statement of all moneys received on account of said home by the treasurer of such board from the state, and a correct and itemized account of all expenditures thereof, including when and for what purpose the same was expended.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 265.

AN ACT to amend section 1, of chapter 513, of the general laws of 1887, entitled, "an act to appropriate a certain sum to the Wisconsin Veterans' Home."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amending section 1, chapter 513, laws 1887.

SECTION 1. Section 1, of chapter 513, of the general laws of 1887, entitled, "an act to appropriate a certain sum to the Wisconsin Veterans' Home" is hereby amended by striking out of said section, at the close thereof, the words: "or such destitute women residents of the state of Wisconsin as were the wives of the Union soldiers, sailors and marines during the time of the civil war," and by adding in lieu thereof, the words, "or such destitute women, residents of the state of Wisconsin, as are the wives or widows of men who were Union soldiers, sailors and marines during the time of the civil war," so that said section, when
