## CHAPTER 306.

AN ACT to provide payment for the officiating chaplains of the assembly.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The sum of fifteen dollars is hereby Pay of chap-authorized to be paid to each and every clergy-lains of assembly. man who has officiated as chaplain of the assembly, for each week of such service, during the session of the legislature for the year 1889, provided no payment shall be made for less than four days' service, said amount to be paid upon the certificate of the chief clerk of the assembly.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated out of Appropriation. the state treasury a sum sufficient to carry out

the provisions of this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
