CHAPTER 356.

AN ACT authorizing the city of Berlin to subscribe for stock in a certain railway company herein named, and to issue bonds in payment therefor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Berlin, in Green Lake county, is hereby authorized to subscribe in the name of said city for the capital stock of the Berlin and Green Lake Rail-

way company to an amount not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars, for the purpose of aiding said company to build its railroad from the city of Berlin, in Green Lake county, to the village of Dartford, in said county, and for the purpose of paying for said stock the common council of said city is authorized to issue and deliver to said railway company the bonds of said city to an amount equal to the amount of such subscription, and not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars, with negotiable coupons or interest warrants attached thereto, for the payment of interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum; and said common council shall, at the time of issuing said bonds, provide for the collection of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay such interest, as it falls due, and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof, within twenty years from the time of the issuing of such bonds. The said subscription shall not be made, nor the bonds issued, until authorized, as follows: Any fifty or more legal voters and resident tax payers of said city may join in a petition to the common council of said city, asking that the matter of bonding the city be submitted to the legal voters thereof, and upon the presentation of said petition the said common council shall call a special election of the legal voters of said city, upon such notice as it may deem proper; and if said election shall, by a majority vote, result in favor of making such subscription and issuing of said bonds, it shall be the duty of said common council to make such subscription and issue such bonds, as herein provided. Said election shall be by ballot, and the ballots may be made to read, "For the railroad bonds," and "Against the railroad bonds"
