CHAPTER 88.

AN ACT to pay to Albert L. Gray a sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of eight hundred and forty-six and seventy-seven one-hundredth dollars to Albert L. Gray, of Fort Howard, to reimburse him for the necessary expense incurred by him in defending his claim and title to his seat in the assembly for the present legislative term against Andrew E. Elmore, contestant therefor.

Appropriation to Albert L. Gray.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 89.

AN ACT to amend chapter 381, of the laws of 1885, relating to the municipal court of the county of Chippewa.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 8, of section 1, of chapter 381, of the laws of 1885, relating to the municipal court of the county of Chippewa, is hereby amended by striking out said subsection and inserting in lieu thereof, the following: Subsection 8. In case of the absence, sickness or disability of said municipal judge he may, by order in writing to be filed in said court, appoint a justice of

the peace of said county to discharge the duties of said judge, during such absence, sickness or disability, who shall have all the powers of said judge while administering such office.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force on and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 90.

AN ACT to authorize the Appleton Cemetery Association to remove the dead from the old burying ground in the city of Appleton, to the new cemetery in said city.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authorizing removal of dead from Appleton Cemetery.

SECTION 1. The trustees of the Appleton Cemetery Association, of the city of Appleton, in the county of Outagamie, state of Wisconsin, are hereby authorized to remove the dead from the old burying ground to the new cemetery, in said city.

Expenses, how paid.

SECTION 2. The city of Appleton is hereby authorized to pay the expenses of the removal of the dead mentioned in the preceding section, and to aid said trustees in carrying out the provisions of said section in a manner to be agreed on between the city of Appleton and said trustees.

Grounds may be sold.

SECTION 3. The trustees are hereby authorized to sell and convey the grounds of the old Appleton Cemetery, in the city of Appleton, county of Outagamie, state of Wisconsin.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
