**CHAPTER 272.**

AN ACT to amend chapter 124, of the private and local laws of 1871, entitled "An act to incorporate the trustees of the Milwaukee county orphan's board."

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

**SECTION 1.** Section 4, of chapter 124, of the private and local laws of 1871, entitled "An act to incorporate the trustees of the Milwaukee county orphan's board," is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 4. The moneys received by the said corporation shall be invested in bonds, secured by mortgage on unincumbered real estate in the county of Milwaukee, or

in bonds of the United States, or of this state, or of any municipality in this state. The mortgaged property to secure such investment of capital shall in every case be worth, in cash, twice the amount loaned thereon, and no investment shall be made except by the unanimous vote of such trustees.

SECTION 2. Section 6, of said chapter 124, of the private and local laws of 1871, is hereby amended by striking out the following words at the end of said section, to wit: "No business shall be transacted by said board at any meeting unless all the members thereof are present," and by inserting in lieu thereof the following: "A majority of all the members of said board shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of such board, and be capable of transacting any business thereof, except as otherwise provided in this chapter," so that said section 6 when so amended shall read as follows: Section 6. The meetings of said board shall be held in the office of the county judge of Milwaukee county, and a record of the proceedings and transactions of said board shall be kept in said office, and be open to the inspection of the public. On the first Monday of April, A. D. 1871, the said board of trustees shall meet and elect a president and secretary. The secretary shall be *ex officio* treasurer of said board of trustees. The annual meeting for the election of officers shall take place on the second Monday of January of each year. If any vacancy shall occur, by death or otherwise, the said board shall fill such vacancy by an election for the unexpired term. A meeting of the said board of trustees may be called at any time by the president or secretary of said board. A majority of all the members of said board shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of such board, and be capable of transacting any business thereof, except as otherwise provided in this chapter.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
