CHAPTER 122.

AN ACT to establish a law uniform with the laws of other states relating to the presentment of notes, checks, drafts or bills of exchange, and abolishing days of grace.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

"No days of grace" allowed.

Section 1. That all promissory notes, checks, drafts and bills of exchange shall hereafter be due and payable as therein provided, without days of grace being allowed.

When notes, checks, drafts, shall fall due after Sunday or a holiday.

SECTION 2. That all promissory notes, checks, drafts or bills of exchange that shall fall due on Sundays or any other legal holiday, shall be payable and presentable for payment on the secular or business day next succeeding such Sunday or holiday.

SECTION 3. All laws or parts of laws contravening the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
