## **CHAPTER 277.**

AN ACT to amend section 4, chapter 402, of the laws of 1889, entitled, "An act to provide for the opening and laying out of temporary highways."

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Relating to the laying out of temporary highways.

SECTION 1. Section 4, of chapter 402, of the laws of 1889, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 4. Such temporary highways shall be public highways, and all the expenses of their laying out shall be paid to the supervisors, and all damages that may be awarded on account of the taking of the land therefor, shall be paid to the person or persons owning such lands by the persons applying for the same, and upon such payment they may enter upon, open and work such highways at their own and sole expense, and may construct thereon logging railroads under such restrictions and regulations as shall be made by resolution of the board of supervisors; but no tree shall be cut therein, except such as shall be necessary to make a track or tracks.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
