CHAPTER 72.

AN ACT to amend section 1, of chapter 139, laws of 1891, relating to liens on logs and lumber.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Lien law amended by adding 'pulp wood' and "charcoal."

SECTION 1. Section 1, of chapter 139, of the laws of 1891, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "staves" in the sixth line thereof the words "pulp wood, or manufacturing any wood into charcoal, or hauling the same," and by inserting after the word "staves" in the eleventh line thereof the words "pulp wood or charcoal," so that said section when amended shall read as follows: Section 1. Any person who shall do or perform any labor or services in cutting, hauling, running, felling, driving, rafting, booming, cribbing, towing, sawing, peeling or manufacturing into lumber or timber, any logs or timber, or cutting any stave bolts or staves, pulp wood, or manufacturing any wood into charcoal, or hauling the same, in any of the counties of this state, shall have a lien upon such logs, timber, lumber, cord wood, railroad ties, tan and other barks, piling, telegraph poles, telephone poles, fence posts, paving timber, stave bolts, staves, pulp wood, or charcoal, for the amount due or to become due for such labor and service, which lien shall take precedence of all other claims, liens or incumbrances thereon or sales thereof, whether such claims, liens, incumbrances or sales are made, created or accrued, before or after the time of doing such work, labor and services.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
