CHAPTER 100.

AN ACT to amend paragraph four, of section 163, of Sanborn and Berryman's annotated statutes, relative to the duties of the attorney general.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Attorney general to examine all applications for loans and to furnish opinions.

Section 1. Paragraph four, of section 163, is hereby amended by adding the following: "State board of health, state board of control, and to examine all applications for loans from any of the trust funds and furnish to the land commissioners his opinion in writing as to the validity of each of such loans, and also of the validity of any bonds or other securities purchased for the benefit of the trust funds," so that said paragraph will read as follows: 4. To give, whenever required, his opinion, in writing, without fee, upon all questions of law submitted to him by the legislature, or either branch thereof, or by the governor, secretary of state, treasurer, or state superintendent, state board of health, state board of control, and to examine all applications for loans from any of the trust funds and furnish to the land commissioners his opinion in writing as to the validity of each of such loans, and also of the validity of any bonds or other securities purchased for the benefit of the trust funds.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
