CHAPTER 148.

AN ACT levying a state tax for the years 1897 and 1898.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There shall be levied and col- State tax of lected for the year 1897, and also for the year of one mill 1898, respectively, a state tax of three-tenths to be levied. (3-10) of one mill for each dollar of the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the state, in addition to all other taxes and charges authorized to be levied by existing laws for each year aforesaid. Said taxes shall be apportioned and certified by the secretary of state, each year as aforesaid, to the several for counties, and by the county clerks of the several counties, to the several towns, cities and incorporated villages in their respective counties, and shall be collected and paid over according to existing laws.

SECTION 2. The secretary of state and state Transfer of treasurer, by and with the consent of the gov- trust funds authorized. ernor, are hereby authorized to transfer from the trust funds of the state to the general fund, in case it may become necessary to meet the expenses of the state government, a sum sufficient for this purpose, to be returned to the trust funds from the general fund revenues of the state for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1898.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
