

corporation. A certificate, duly signed and acknowledged by the secretary and the presiding officer of such corporation, containing a copy of such resolution and showing the name adopted, shall be filed and recorded at the same place and in the same manner as the original certificate of incorporation. Such corporation shall, from and after the filing of such certificate, be known by the name so adopted. The register of deeds shall note on the margin of the record of the original articles of incorporation such change of name, together with the book and page where the certificate herein provided for is recorded.

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 55.

AN ACT to cede certain lands in Calumet county, Wisconsin, to the United States.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The consent of the state of Wisconsin is hereby granted and given to the purchase by the United States of so much of lots 23 and 24 of the Stockbridge reservation in the county of Calumet and state of Wisconsin, as it may desire to secure from the owners thereof either by purchase or by the necessary condemnation proceedings, to be used for the purpose of constructing a harbor thereon, for the east shore of Lake Winnebago, and to erect thereon

all necessary buildings including a light-house, and to do all such other things as may be necessary to carry out the purpose aforesaid; and the state of Wisconsin hereby cedes to the United States exclusive jurisdiction over said lands so acquired for the purpose aforesaid, and such buildings and improvements as it may erect and maintain thereon, or in connection therewith, during the time the United States shall be and remain the owner thereof; provided, however, that the state of Wisconsin shall so far retain a concurrent jurisdiction with the United States in and over the tract of land aforesaid, that all civil and criminal process issued under the authority of this state, or any officer thereof duly qualified to issue the same, may be executed on said lands and in the buildings that are, or may be erected thereon, in the same way and manner, and to the same extent, as if jurisdiction had not been ceded by this act, and that any offense against the laws of this state committed on the lands or premises herein described, may be tried and punished by any competent court or magistrate of the state, to the same extent as if this act had not been passed.

Exempted

SECTION 2. The lands above described with their appurtenances, buildings and other property that may be thereon, shall be exempted from all taxes and assessments so long as the same shall remain the property of the United States of America.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
