## CHAPTER 125.

AN ACT to prevent the unlawful and fraudulent use of transfer tickets issued by street railroad companies and to provide a penalty therefor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Transfers, who are entitled to. SECTION 1. No transfer ticket, or written or printed instrument, giving or purporting to give the right of transfer to any person or persons from a public conveyance operated upon one line or route of a street railroad to a public conveyance upon another line or route of a street railroad, or from one car to another car upon the same line of street railroad, shall be issued, sold or given, except to a passenger lawfully entitled thereto.

Penalty for misuse of transfer. SECTION 2. No person shall issue, sell or give away such a transfer ticket or instrument as aforesaid to a person or persons not lawfully entitled thereto, and any person or persons not lawfully entitled thereto who shall receive and use, or offer for passage, any such transfer ticket or instrument, or who shall sell or give away such transfer ticket or instrument to another with intent to have such transfer ticket or instrument used, or offered for passage after the time limit for its use shall have expired, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than ten dollars for each such offense.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
