CHAPTER 248.

AN ACT to provide for the remodeling of that portion of the south wing of the capitol building, now occupied by the State Historical Society, and making an appropriation therefor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The superintendent of public property is hereby authorized, by and under the direction of the governor, to procure plans and specifications for the remodeling of that portion of the south wing of the capitol building now occupied by the state historical society, said plans to provide for not less than nine committee rooms for the exclusive use of committees of the legislature when in session, to be located upon the main floor now occupied by the said historical society, and also for a general assembly room for the exclusive use of committee work for the legislature when in session, to be located upon the upper floor. When such plans and specifications have been prepared, and approved by the governor, and the premises vacated by the state historical society, said superintendent of public property shall advertise for bids for remodeling the same in accordance with the plans and specifications so prepared, and shall specify in said advertisement, and in the contract made in pursuance thereof, that the said work shall be completed prior to the first day of January 1901. The said superintendent shall require the contractor to give a good and sufficient bond for the faithful performance of the said contract, which bond shall be approved by the governor.

Providing for not less than nine committee rooms and a general assembly room.

Governor to approve plans.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury, not otherwise

appropriated, four thousand dollars, for the purposes of this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 249.

AN ACT to amend section 170 of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898, so as to allow the state board of control to employ an additional clerk to be known as the assistant chief clerk.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

An assistant
chief clerk
authorized at

SECTION 1. For the purpose of authorizing the state board of control to employ an additional clerk to be designated as the assistant chief clerk, the last paragraph in that part of section 170 of the revised statutes which fixes the compensation of the members of said board, its secretary, clerks and stenographer, being the last paragraph in the section save two, is hereby amended to read as follows: **Section 170.** The other persons employed in the office of the board of control the following sums: A chief clerk twelve hundred dollars, an assistant chief clerk, nine hundred dollars, an additional clerk seven hundred and twenty dollars and a stenographer seven hundred and twenty dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.
