CHAPTER 257.

AN ACT relative to the laying out of highways in towns having a resident population of eight thousand, or over, and amendatory of section 1291 of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Elector's approval not necessary.

SECTION 1. Section 1291 of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof, the following: "provided that when any such damages shall be awarded, pursuant to an order for the laying out, widening or altering of a highway, lying wholly within a town whose resident population shall be eight thousand persons, or over, according to the last state or United States census, that then and in such case, it shall not be necessary that such order or award be approved, or the highway accepted by said electors, but the same shall be valid without such approval or acceptance."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.
