CHAPTER 124.

AN ACT to confer upon the judge of the district court in any county, having a district court, which is a court of record, the same powers as are conferred by chapter 32 of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898 upon county judges in their respective counties, as to the examination of persons alleged to be insane, and the commitment of persons adjudged to be insane to the hospital or asylum.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

Jurisdiction of district judge as to examinations for insanity. Section 1. There is hereby conferred upon the judge of the district court in any county having a district court, which is a court of record, the same powers in respect to the examination of persons in such county alleged to be insane, and the commitment of persons adjudged to be insane, to the hospital or asylum, as is conferred by chapter 32 of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898 upon the county judges in their respective counties. Such cases before said district judge shall be conducted in accordance with the procedure prescribed by law in similar cases before county judges.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.
