CHAPTER 161.

AN ACT providing for the compilations of the opinions of the attorneys general.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

Compilation to be done without expense to the state. Section 1. The attorney general is hereby authorized and directed to compile and edit the opinions of the attorneys general of this state from the organization of the state government to the present time, and to prepare for publication such of said opinions as he may find to be of general importance. He shall also prepare a full index thereof: "provided that such compilation shall be made without expense to the state.

Publication of opinions. Section 2. Said opinions shall be published by the commissioners of public printing in the public documents of the state and there shall also be published by the commissioners of public printing one thousand separate copies, to be bound in cloth, of which number one hundred and fifty copies shall be delivered to the attorney general, for distribution, and the balance shall be delivered to the superintendent of public property and distributed by him in the manner provided by law for the distribution of reports of the other elective state officers.

Section 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
