March 1, 1903, eighty-seven thousand dollars; to the state public school to March 1, 1903, eighty thousand dollars; to the Wisconsin home for feeble-minded to January 1, 1903, eighty-eight thousand dollars; to the Wisconsin state reformatory to April 1, 1903, eighty thousand dollars.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 187.

AN ACT to prohibit the catching of brook trout in the rivers known as Brunsweiller and Trout Brook located in Ashland county until April 15, 1903.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

Closed season. Section 1. It shall be unlawful and is prohibited, until April 15, 1903, for any person to fish for, eatch or kill with any device or in any manner, any variety of trout in the rivers known as Brunsweiller and Trout Brook located in Ashland county.

Penalty for fishing in closed season. Section 2. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of section 1, shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than six months or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.
