

to institute proper suit or suits to vacate such fraudulent or preferential conveyance, transfer or charge, it shall be lawful for any creditor of the assignor to institute and prosecute to judgment any such suit in the name of the assignee and for his benefit, upon giving to the assignee a bond in the sum of not less than five hundred dollars with sufficient surety resident of this state to hold the said assignee harmless from all costs or expenses to arise or accrue to him in case said suit shall be decided adversely to him; said bond to be approved by the judge of the court in which such action is to be brought. In case of recovery in such action the creditor so prosecuting the same shall be allowed out of the estate all reasonable costs and charges which he has paid or become liable to pay in prosecution of such suit or suits; such costs and expenses to be determined by the court.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 208.

AN ACT to authorize Albert B. Stevenson, his heirs or assigns, to construct and maintain a dock or pier in the waters of Little Sturgeon Bay, Door county Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

Location of dock. SECTION 1. Albert B. Stevenson, his heirs or assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to construct and maintain a dock or pier extending into the waters of Little Sturgeon Bay in front of and appurtenant to lot number three, section eleven, township twenty-seven, range twenty-four in Door county state of Wisconsin.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.
