CHAPTER 275.

AN ACT to authorize the governor to loan two Wisconsin battle flags of the civil war to the General Grant Monument Association.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

What flags to be loaned. SECTION 1. The governor is authorized to loan, for an indefinite period, to the General Grant Monument Association, two battle flags, one from each of two regiments that served under General Grant during the civil war, and have two sets of flags, said flags to be properly labeled and placed in the proposed collection of flags in a room in General Grant's monument at Riverside Park, New York City.

Conflicting laws repealed. SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 276.

AN ACT to legalize actions of courts, county boards, common councils, village and town boards in laying out, widening, extending or vacating streets, alleys, highways et cetera, under section 3187a of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898, as amended by chapter 351 of the laws of 1899.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

All proceedings legalized; actions to annul or vacate, when to be brought. SECTION 1. In all proceedings heretofore taken for laying out, widening, extending or vacating any street, alley,
