CHAPTER 311.

AN ACT to amend chapter 45 of the laws of 1899, being an act to provide for the paying of a bounty for the killing of wolves, and repealing all conflicting laws.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

Bounty for wolves and wolf cubs. SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 45 of the laws of Wisconsin for the year 1899, is hereby amended by inserting between the words "wolf" and "by" in the second line of said section, the words "cub under six months of age;" and by inserting between the words "dollars" and "and" in the third line of said section, the words, "and every person who shall kill any mature wolf by poison or otherwise shall be entitled to a reward of five dollars;" so that said section, when amended, shall read as follows: Section 1. Every person who shall kill any wolf cub under six months of age, by poison or otherwise, shall be entitled to a reward of three dollars, and every person who shall kill any mature wolf, by poison or otherwise, shall be entitled to a reward of five dollars, to be paid by the county wherein said wolf was killed, on presentation to the county clerk of the town chairman's certificate provided for in section 1627 of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898. Nothing in this act shall prohibit any county from increasing said bounty or reward by a majority vote of its county board at any annual meeting, provided that no county shall pay more than six dollars reward for the killing of a full grown wolf.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.
