rights and privileges as commissoners in other towns. This section shall not apply to cities of the first class, but in such cities the ward superintendents shall perform the duties of commissioners of weeds."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 52.

AN ACT to regulate the matter of fixing the compensation of county superintendents in counties containing two superintendent districts, and amendatory of section 461d of the statutes of 1898.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

Limit to expenditure; more than one superintendent. Section 1. Section 461d of the statutes of 1898 is hereby amended so as to read as follows: The county board shall allow the county superintendent such sum over and above his salary as he shall certify he has actually expended in traveling expenses in the discharge of his official duties, not exceeding two hundred dollars in any one year; and such expenses shall be audited and allowed by the county board at its annual meeting in November. In a county where there is more than one superintendent district the vote of the members of the board representing each such district shall be taken separately. Any sum of money so voted and allowed to any such superintendent shall be charged and assessed against and upon the district for whose superintendent the same is appropriated.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
