CHAPTER 38.

AN ACT granting to the United States jurisdiction over certain lands in Brown county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

Jurisdiction, except for service of civil and criminal process. Section 1. The consent of the state of Wisconsin is hereby given to the purchase, by the United States, of any tract or tracts of land in the city of Green Bay, and county of Brown, within the state, for the site of and the erection of a federal building under the provisions of an act of congress, approved June 6, 1902, entitled: "An act to increase the limit of cost of certain public buildings, to authorize the purchase of sites for public buildings, to authorize the erection and completion of public buildings, and for other purposes," and the state hereby cedes to the United States exclusive jurisdiction over such tract or tracts of land as shall be purchased for the purposes aforesaid, so long as the same shall be or remain the property of the United States, for all purposes except the service of civil or criminal process therein.

Land exempt from taxes. Section 2. That the lands, aforesaid, when so purchased, shall thereafter be exempt from all taxes and assessments levied, or imposed under authority of the state, so long as the same shall remain the property of the United States.

Section 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
