Conflicting laws repealed. Section 2. All acts and parts of acts in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER 140.

AN ACT to regulate the manufacture and sale of firecrackers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

What firecrackers not to be manufactured or sold. Section 1. No person shall sell or keep for sale, or manufacture or bring into this state for use therein, any firecrackers containing dynamite, chlorate of potash, or any explosive, except ordinary gun powder, composed of saltpeter, sulphur and charcoal. No firecracker composed of ordinary gun powder shall be sold or kept for sale unless the same shall be five inches in length or less and not more the [than] seven-eighths of an inch in diameter. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be subject to be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars and not more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail for a term of not less than six months nor more than one year, or both, in the discretion of the court.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after January 1st, 1906.
