

sions shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison not more than five years nor less than one year, or by fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, nor less than two hundred dollars. No person, and no agent or officer of any corporation within the purview of this act shall be privileged from testifying in relation to anything therein prohibited; and no person having so testified shall be liable to any prosecution or punishment for any offense concerning which he was required to give his testimony or produce any documentary evidence. *The term "free pass" shall include any form of ticket or mileage entitling the holder to travel over any part of the line or lines of any railroad issued to the holder as a gift or in consideration or partial consideration of any service performed or to be performed by such holder except where such ticket or mileage is used by such holder in the performance of his duties as an employee of the railroad issuing the same.*

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 487.

AN ACT providing for the taxation of vessels and other water craft.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Taxation of vessels. SECTION 1. All ships, boats and vessels and their appurtenances belonging to inhabitants of this state, whether at home or abroad, shall be taxed as personal property.

Law repealed. SECTION 2. Chapter 192 of the laws of 1901 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after May 1st, 1906.
